**Before—**  
Provenance-based access with finding aids derived from processing

- Separate access to various series (membership records, Fellowship nominations, memorial files)
- Only processed files indexed
- Open and closed files (deceased and living members) are intermingled in unprocessed records, making systematic processing difficult

**After—**  
Name-based access derived from original membership tracking data

- Brings together materials from all series or collections
- Shows what holdings are **likely to exist** for unprocessed materials
- Processing happens in response to requests
- Allows references/links to published material and to holdings in other repositories

People are the most logical access point for certain types of archival holdings. An access tool that is based on personal names instead of on the arrangement of records can be both a research tool in itself and a way to bring together resources from different collections, different repositories, or different formats. Even unprocessed materials can be included.

A name-based access strategy is applicable wherever there's a group of people with a known relationship to the organization and its records, such as a membership organization or a university archives.

The Encoded Archival Context (EAC) structure enables creation of true finding aids based on names, not just indexes. EAC records for personal or corporate names can include name authority work, basic identifying characteristics, biographical notes, links to related names, archival holdings, and published sources; and allow the option to interconnect with traditional finding aids in EAD.

is a resource guide to information about past architects.

- Finding aid to multiple member-related record series in AIA Archives
- Includes all 50,324 members 1857-1978
- Also includes 1,089 non-member architects and 5,982 firm names
- Indexed to 9 published reference works
- Digitized copies of AIA Archives materials attached to record as requests are received
- Links to holdings at architectural archives around the country
- Site still under construction (to adapt for software available in-house)

William Wilson Wurster was born in Stockton, CA, and earned his degree in architecture from the University of California, Berkeley in 1919. Wurster's work, primarily residential during his early career, was exhibited and published nationwide. Wurster teamed with partners Theodore Bernardi (in 1944) and Donn Emmons (in 1945) to form Wurster, Bernardi, & Emmons (WBE). The firm, well-known for their modern designs, won the American Institute of Architects architectural firm award in 1965, and Wurster was honored with the AIA Gold Medal in 1969. In 1950 Wurster became dean of architecture at UC Berkeley, and in 1959 he brought the departments of architecture, landscape architecture, and city and regional planning together to form the College of Environmental Design.
