- Part of selection criteria for grant-funded preservation projects
- Part of selection criteria for weekly radio program From the Vault
- Check before production of fund raising giveaways
- Licensing requests

INTRO: This program was originally produced in October for Unlearning to Not Speak by Lois Hansen of the KPFA Women. It begins with a short play by Myrna Lamb, "What Have You Done For Me Lately?" and continues, after about a half hour, with four Bay Area women telling of their experiences of unwanted pregnancy. The first sounds we hear in the play are those of a man groaning, coming to as the anaesthesia wears off. He is lying in a hospital bed, and his doctor is walking around him.

OUTRO: You heard Lois Hansen of KPFA and three other women in a discussion of their experiences because of unwanted pregnancy and their resulting efforts to get abortions. Their true stories were preceded by a fictional account, in the play by Myrna Lamb "What Have You Done For Me Lately," of a man's pregnancy, induced by a female doctor who had been forced to bear that man's child 19 years earlier because she couldn't get an abortion. This program was first heard in Oct. on the KFTA women's program, Unlearning to Not.

Producer credit on tape?

- Pacifica's relationship with producer plays an important role
- Often use "Institutional Memory" to assess relationship

 - Live performances-- In Pacifica studios or outside?
 Was it a concert benefitting Pacifica?
 - Pre-recorded
 - Complete songs?
 - Is it the focus of the program or an intro/outro?


