Publication Requests: All publication rights must be cleared through the Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum Licensing Department. Copies of archival materials requested at time of research are for reference use only and do not include publication rights. Researchers must disclose the intent to quote, cite, or reproduce archival material in any publication to the Guggenheim Licensing Department. Please note that this policy applies to all publications, whether print, digital, broadcast or web, and including, without limitation, e-books and mobile applications.

Making a Request: All requests must be in writing. Your request must specify the material you seek permission to use, the purpose of your request, the nature of the project, and relevant reproduction and distribution information. For book and other editorial requests, please include print run, publication date, title, author, and number of editions, including foreign-language editions.

Fees: Fees are determined by a number of factors, including the nature of the project, the scope of distribution, and the type of media. For projects in which the Guggenheim agrees to create new photographs or scans, there will be additional charges for time and expenses; these will be estimated and agreed to in advance. In all cases, a complimentary copy of the publication must be provided to the Guggenheim Licensing Department.

We offer reduced fees for not for-profit organizations, and for the Guggenheim's sponsors and members. All fees support the Guggenheim's not-for-profit mission.
