## AN ANNOUNCEMENT TO RECIPIENTS OF THE PLACEMENT NEWSLETTER

In an effort to reorganize the Society's publications program, the Editorial Board has asked the SAA Council to make two important changes in the Placement Newsletter. The board has recommended that the newsletter be sent to all individual and institutional members of the SAA--but only to members. The sole exception is the non-member who has paid for an applicant listing; that person is to receive the newsletter so long as he or she advertises in it. In addition, the board has advised that the newsletter appear five, rather than six, times annually: in January, March, June, September, and November.

The Council is expected to endorse the Editorial Board's recommendations at a meeting on 28 December 1972, and I am anticipating that decision by announcing the new policies in this issue. Beginning with the March, 1973 number, our publication will appear as the SAA Newsletter. It will continue to carry notices of job openings, listings of applicants, details of forthcoming professional meetings, and announcements of courses in archival administration. Moreover, the Society's officers, Council, and committees will use the newsletter to solicit the opinions of the membership at large on matters of interest to the archival profession. We will mail the newsletter to all individual and institutional members of the SAA, as well as to non-members who are currently advertising in the newsletter. The newsletter will be mailed as second class matter.
